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Division I and Wheelchair National Championships Come to Baltimore, April 21-24

(Colorado Springs, Colo.) – National titles will be on the line in Baltimore as the best fencers in the world compete in the final event of the season at the USA Fencing Division I and Wheelchair National Championships from April 21-24.

The four-day event will feature Olympic and Paralympic Team members fencing for gold at the Baltimore Convention Center, 1 W. Pratt St., Baltimore, Md. Competition runs from 8 a.m. – 8 p.m. daily. All events are free and open to the public.

The tournament includes both individual titles for Division I and Wheelchair events as well as Division I Team gold medals.

Eight Olympians and five Paralympians are scheduled to compete, including medalists from the 2016 Rio and 2012 London Olympic Games:

- Daryl Homer (Bronx, N.Y. / Division I Men's Saber), 2016 Olympic individual silver medalist
- **Ibtihaj Muhammad (Maplewood, N.J. / Division I Women's Saber)**, 2016 Olympic team bronze medalist
- Courtney Hurley (San Antonio, Texas / Division I Women's Epee), 2012 Olympic team bronze medalist
- Kelley Hurley (San Antonio, Texas / Division I Women's Epee), 2012 Olympic team bronze medalist
- Susie Scanlan (New York City, N.Y. / Division I Women's Epee), 2012 Olympic team bronze medalist
- Kat Holmes (Washington, D.C. / Division I Women's Epee), 2016 Olympian
- Jason Pryor (South Euclid, Ohio / Division I Men's Epee), 2016 Olympian
- Jeff Spear (Wynantskill, N.Y. / Division I Men's Saber), 2012 Olympian
- Joey Brinson (Florence, Miss. / Wheelchair Men's Foil and Saber), 2012 and 2016 Paralympian
- Lauryn DeLuca (Parma, Ohio / Wheelchair Women's Epee and Foil), 2016 Paralympian
- Gerard Moreno (Los Angeles, Calif. / Wheelchair Men's Foil and Saber), Four-time Paralympian
- Andrea DeMello (New York City, N.Y. / Wheelchair Women's Epee and Saber), Four-time Paralympian (2008 for Team USA, Three-time Paralympian for Brazil)
- Curtis Lovejoy (College Park, Ga. / Wheelchair Men's Epee and Foil), Five-time Paralympian (2000 Fencing Paralympian, Five-time Swimming Paralympian)

The Division I women's epee field is expected to be one of the deepest of the tournament as the event not only includes three Olympic medalists, but marks the first return to competition for London team medalist **Susie Scanlan (New York City, N.Y.)** since Scanlan took the runner-up position at the 2013 NCAA Championships behind Courtney Hurley.

In addition to titles being awarded in Baltimore, the Division I Nationals also will serve as the final qualifying event for the 2017 Senior World Championships.

The men's epee and men's saber teams each have closely contested races for positions on Team USA.

The first two positions on the men's epee team have been secured by first-time team members Adam Rodney (New York City, N.Y.) and Cooper Schumacher (Parsippany, N.J.) Rio Olympian Jason Pryor (South Euclid, Ohio) holds the third position in the rankings, but a broken leg sustained on the World Cup circuit in February put the former No. 1 out of competition for the Grand Prix of the selection period in March. Alex Tsinis (Little Neck, N.Y.) is currently ranked fourth and the two-time individual Division National Champion is seeking to earn enough points to qualify for his second Senior World Team. A 2011 Junior World Team member, James Kaull (New York City, N.Y. / Washington, D.C.) won gold at the January North American Cup and is within striking distance of Tsinis after a pair of top-64 results on the World Cup circuit. Former Senior World Team Champion Ben Bratton (New York City, N.Y.) earned his first top-eight finish at a Grand Prix in Budapest last month to climb from No. 39 to No. 6 in the National Team Point Standings after a year-long sabbatical from international competition.

A trio of Olympians have guaranteed their positions on the men's saber squad with Rio teammates **Daryl Homer (Bronx, N.Y.)** and **Eli Dershwitz (Sherborn, Mass.)** remaining in the No. 1 and No. 2 positions in the standings. London Olympian **Jeff Spear (Wynantskill, N.Y.)** is the two-time reigning National Champion, but will be fencing in just his fourth tournament of the season as the No. 3 men's saber fencer in the nation. Three former Junior World Team members are in contention for the final position on the team with their results in Baltimore determining who qualifies for Team USA. **Ben Natanzon (Manalapan, N.J.)** placed eighth at his second Junior World Championships last week and is ranked fourth in the senior team standings. A 2014 Junior World team bronze medalist, **Geoffrey Loss (Laguna Beach, Calif.)** sits in fifth after a top-32 result at the Cancun Grand Prix in December. **Evan Prochniak (Hudson, N.H.)** won bronze with Homer in the team event at the 2010 Junior World Championships and needs a podium finish to potentially earn his first Senior World Team berth.

More than 20 athletes from throughout the Baltimore and Washington, D.C. metropolitan areas will be fencing in the Division I events, including:

- Amanda Sirico (Bowie, Md. / Women's Epee), two-time Junior World team medalist
- Rebecca Chimahusky (Wheaton, Md. / Women's Epee), 2016 Division IA National Champion
- Peter Souders (Silver Spring, Md. / Men's Saber), two-time Senior World Team member
- James Kaull (New York City, N.Y. / Washington, D.C. / Men's Epee), 2011 Junior World Team member
- Dennis Kraft (Arlington, Va. / Men's Epee), 2015 Oslo Men's Satellite Tournament Champion

In addition to the Division I and Wheelchair National Championships, the April North American Cup also will be contested in Baltimore with fencers from around the world competing in the following events: Division II, Division III, Veteran Age Group (40-49, 50-59, 60-69, +70, Open) and Veteran Team.
